

## <u>Formal Notification of Changes to WHS Accreditation Scheme Reporting</u> <u>Requirements – June 2023</u>

From 1 August 2023, the following changes to the reporting requirements of all companies accredited under the Workplace, Health and Safety Accreditation Scheme (the Scheme) will be in effect.

Under the *Building and Construction Industry (Improving Productivity) (Accreditation Scheme)* Rules 2019, Section 15(1)(e) the accredited person must comply with the reporting requirements notified to the person under subsection (2) from time to time.

The updated Scheme incident reporting submission requirements are as follows:
